The Dudley Underground Experience is a unique educational boat trip through the Dudley Limestone Caverns and Tunnels, located beneath the Black Country. These tunnels, originally carved out during the Industrial Revolution, were used for mining limestone, which played a crucial role in canal building and industry.



TO EXPECT:

Boat Journey:

Travel through the hidden tunnels and vast underground caverns, guided by expert skippers.

Sound & Light Shows:

Engaging visual and audio displays bring the region's history to life.

Mining & Industrial Heritage:

Learn how these tunnels supplied materials that fuelled the Industrial Revolution.

Fossil Discoveries:

See ancient fossils embedded in the limestone, offering a glimpse into a prehistoric world.

LIFE ON A WORKING BOAT

This engaging, hands-on experience is perfect for teachers looking to spark their students' curiosity about the past. Through real-life artefacts, and hands-on activities, they'll discover what daily life was like aboard a narrowboat during the Industrial Revolution. Explore our historic boat, Sagitta, and see first-hand the cramped living quarters where entire families lived while transporting goods along the canals.

SEDIMENTARY ROCKS & FOSSILS

Children will travel back 428 million years to uncover the secrets hidden in the Silurian limestone of the Black Country. They'll get up-close with real fossils, including the famous "Dudley Bug" trilobite, and learn all about how sedimentary rocks form. Pupils will handle and examine fascinating fossils and rocks, identifying the different species.

WATERY WILDLIFE

In this fun and interactive session, children will explore the fascinating wildlife that lives along the Black Country's historic canals. From ducks and dragonflies to bats and badgers, pupils will discover the importance of canals for local biodiversity.

VISITING FAQ5

What should we wear?

Our boats are open-top, and the tunnels can get quite drippy, so we recommend bringing a waterproof jacket - even in summer. We'll provide you with a hard hat to wear on the boat.

Can I visit the Portal Building in advance? Yes! Simply send us an email, and we'll arrange a convenient time for your visit.

Are you suitable for SEND pupils?

Absolutely. Our accessible boat can accommodate up to two unpowered wheelchairs, or one electric wheelchair. If your group has additional requirements, please get in touch to discuss any reasonable adjustments we can make.

How long can we stay at the Portal Building?

Most schools typically arrive at 10 AM and depart at 2 PM.

Can our coaches park on-site?

Yes, we have a designated coach parking area.

What age groups are the workshops suitable for?

We tailor our workshops to meet the needs and ages of the pupils attending.

Who would lead our workshop?

Our Learning Facilitators have extensive experience in education, having worked as teachers or in similar educational roles at other organisations.

How many children can you accommodate? We can currently accommodate up to 90 pupils per day.
